# **Easter Holiday Activities**

## **Chicken Pox**

We are currently experiencing a high number of chicken pox cases within school. Chicken pox is common and mostly affects children, but you can get it at any age. It usually gets better by itself after 1 to 2 weeks without needing to see a GP.

Some symptoms to look out for are small spots that become blisters, but also a high temperature, aches and pains, loss of appetite and generally feeling unwell.

If your child develops chicken pox they will need to stay away from school until all the spots have formed a scab, this usually takes 5 days.

## **Breakfast and After School Club**



We have an amazing Breakfast and After School Club which runs daily during term time.

Breakfast club is open from 7.50am and is priced at £3 per child per day. Each child will be given some healthy breakfast ready for the day ahead.

After School Club is open until 6pm and is priced at £6 per child per day. Every child will be given a small snack followed by a fun activity.
